

This year's virtual 33rd FIRST Annual Conference attracted an aggregated online audience of 10,000. On June 7 to 9, 2021, international experts came together and shared their perspectives and experiences with a global audience of incident responders and security teams through presentations, panels, and Q&A sessions.

We designed the conference program, themed Crossing Uncertain Times, to be of value to incident responders and security teams of all levels of expertise. Highlights included a keynote by Steven Adair of Volexity - 'An Unauthorized Exchange - From Targeted Espionage to the Global Cyber Pandemic,' 'Defense Through Invisibility: Zero Trust Security for the Enterprise' by Jason Garbis, Author and Senior VP at Appgate, and 'Gaining CISO Support and Improving

Security Operations Situational Awareness with Threat Briefings' by Angela Wu of VMware.

ICASI integrates into FIRST PSIRT SIG, bolstering the incident response and security team industry

ICASI, the Industry Consortium for Advancement of Security on the Internet, was officially integrated into FIRST on May 28, 2021. Established in 2008, ICASI's purpose was to strengthen the global security landscape by driving excellence and innovation in security response practices, facilitating collaboration among members to analyze, mitigate, and resolve multi-stakeholder, global security challenges.

This important role will continue as part of the existing FIRST PSIRT SIG, expanding and improving the community's ability to respond to vulnerabilities across multiple vendors.

Pete Allor, Co-Chair of the PSIRT SIG says: "It's great to have ICASI as part of the FIRST community as we can expand our coordinated response to vulnerability issues affecting components across multiple vendors affecting many ecosystems. We look forward to defining and expanding our Incident Response best practices and collective response for use globally."

For more than ten years, ICASI has led the way in advancing multi-vendor coordinated vulnerability disclosure, introducing the Common Vulnerability Reporting Framework (CVRF) standard, developing the

principles of a Unified Security Incident Response Plan (USIRP), helping to create the Guidelines and Practices for Multi-Party Vulnerability Coordination and Disclosure, and modeling a trusted group of industry leaders that successfully coordinated multi-vendor responses to numerous security incidents. ICASI will dissolve as an independent organization and transfer its assets to FIRST to continue these successes and secure broader participation across the global community.

Klee Michaelis, Chair of ICASI says: "ICASI and FIRST have enjoyed a close relationship with members of ICASI already participating in FIRST activities, working together on advancing vulnerability management and coordinated disclosure. Closely aligning the knowledge and experience of ICASI with the FIRST community will enable the continued evolution of vulnerability disclosure."

Serge Droz, former Chair of FIRST, said: "The past year has been difficult for everyone. The global pandemic resulted in incident responders working, mostly from home, sometimes struggling with the anxiety of the pandemic while at the same time fighting an increasing number of criminals who were attacking an already strained resource. Our staff and volunteers adapted to the new conditions at FIRST by delivering several virtual events and initiatives to replace our in-person events, while also maintaining business as usual for our other key activities. This also created new opportunities for people to engage that would previously not attend in-person meetings, helping us reach our goal of being inclusive and global. We also launched a new code of ethics for incident response and security teams and increased our focus on diversity and inclusion in the industry."

A new fellowship team joins FIRST - Malawi CERT

MwCERT started with a small team in 2018 and has been slowly growing in size since then. MwCERT was established according to section 6 of the Electronic Transaction and Cyber Security Act (2016) of the laws of Malawi to take charge of critical Information Infrastructure Protection actions and serve as a base for national coordination to respond to cybersecurity threats.

The organization aims to be the trusted cybersecurity emergency response team that makes Malawi and the world a safe cyberspace. Its mission is to provide a comprehensive set of responses to cybersecurity threats and vulnerabilities through national coordination with all stakeholders to effectively respond and prevent cybersecurity incidents for critical infrastructures and other systems of national interest.

The mwCERT team is honored to have been awarded the Suguru Yamaguchi Fellowship Program. As a new entity, the MwCERT is still in its early stages of implementing its duties to the Malawi nation and the world.

Jeffrey Carpenter and Dan Kaminsky newly inducted into FIRST's Incident Response Hall of Fame

Jeffrey Carpenter and (posthumously) Dan Kaminsky are this year's new inductees of FIRST's Incident Response Hall of Fame. Hall of Fame nominations come from past inductees; members of the FIRST Board of directors; every representative, secondary representative of a team member; and FIRST liaison members and Individuals in the Incident Response community.



Jeffrey Carpenter has dedicated more than 30 years to improving the state of information security. In 1995, Jeffrey joined the CERT® Coordination Center, at Carnegie Mellon University's Software Engineering Institute, initially as an incident response analyst, then five years later managing more than 50 technical individuals. He was instrumental in helping the U.S. Department of Defence and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security create teams to exchange incident information and indicators between government and critical infrastructure organizations. He also worked closely with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security on the formation of US-CERT, the national computer security incident response team (CSIRT) for the United States.

Jeffrey helped many other governments and regional organizations around the world establish national incident response capabilities. He founded a successful annual conference for technical staff working for CSIRTs with national responsibility to promote collaboration among these organizations.

Jeffrey's active involvement in the incident response community over the years has included presenting in various forums and serving on Forum of Incident Response and Security Teams (FIRST) committees and working groups. Jeffrey currently is the Secureworks Senior Director of Incident Response Consulting and Threat Intelligence.

"I am humbled by this honor. This recognition also reflects the efforts of my former colleagues at the CERT Coordination Center to advance the incident response community, for I could not have had any success without them. In addition, it is a privilege to be inducted with my friend Dan Kaminsky, whose work in incident response and product security impacted so many people. We miss him dearly."

Dan Kaminsky (1979 – 2021) was a noted American security researcher - best known for his work finding a critical flaw in the Internet's Domain Name System (DNS) and leading what became the largest synchronized fix to the Internet infrastructure of all time in 2008. He was also known for being a great human - helping colleagues, friends, and community members attend events, working on many health apps, assisting color-blind people, hearing aid technology and telemedicine, and fighting as a privacy rights advocate. His ethos was to do things because they were the right thing to do, not because they would elicit financial gain.



Dan was co-founder and chief scientist of WhiteOps (recently renamed Human) and spent his career advising several Fortune 500 companies such as Cisco, Avaya, and Microsoft on their cybersecurity. In addition, Dan spent three years working with Microsoft on their Vista, Server 2008, and Windows 7 releases.

Many FIRST members are aware of Dan - some had the privilege of meeting and working with him. All of us will miss him and the energy, creativity, curiosity, and, above all, the fun he brought to our world.

The New York Times labeled him an "Internet security savior" - an honorific too often given but, in this case, very well deserved.


Jeffrey and Dan join past inductees Ian Cook, Don Stikvoort, and Klaus-Peter Kossakowski.
